D+ News: September 2022

- **Australian** researchers have discovered a 380-million-year-old heart of ancient fish - the oldest ever found in an ancient jawed fish.
- **Austrian** photographer Gerald Rhemann's Disconnection Event won the prestigious Astronomy Photograph of the Year award. The image shows a piece of Comet Leonard's tail breaking off and being carried away by the solar wind.
- **Bangladesh** clinched their maiden SAFF Women's Football Championship title with a 3-1 victory over Nepal in the final at the Dasarath Rangasala in Kathmandu.
- **Brazilian** scientists have identified the world's oldest mammal, *Brasilodon quadrangularis*, using fossil dental records – predating the previously confirmed earliest mammal by about 20 million years.
- **Chinese** scientists have for the first time discovered a new mineral on the Moon, named Changesite-(Y), making China the third country to discover a new mineral on the moon.
- **Egypt** and **Qatar** signed three Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), including one between the two nations' sovereign wealth funds, during the Egyptian president Abdel Fattah al-Sisi's visit to Doha.
- Researches from the University of Reading in **England** have discovered a dinosaur fossil with skin in southern Alberta in Canada.
- Archaeologists in Georgia have discovered a 1.8-million-year-old tooth belonging to an early species of human, near the village of Orozmani, around 100 km (62 miles) southwest of the **Georgian** capital of Tbilisi.
- **India** launched its first domestically produced aircraft carrier, 262-meter-long, 60-meter-wide carrier, called Vikrant or "courageous".
- A 31,000-year-old skeleton of a young adult unearthed in a cave in **Indonesia** provides the oldest known evidence of an amputation.
- **Italian** Grand Prix motorcycle racer Enea Bastianini won the 2022 Aragon MotoGP with a last lap victory.
- Rocket Lab successfully launched a **Japanese** radar imaging satellite, the StriX-1 satellite for Japanese company Synspec, from New Zealand.
- **Poland's** Iga Swiatek claimed her third career Grand Slam Tennis title at the 2022 US Open in New York defeating Ons Jabeu, 6-2, 7-6(5), in the final.
- A **Russian** Soyuz rocket carrying NASA astronaut Frank Rubio and Russian cosmonauts Sergey Prokopyev and Dmitri Petelin successfully launched to the International Space Station.
- The Kingdom of **Saudi Arabia** announced the discovery of new sites for gold and copper ore deposits in the Madinah region, within the boundaries of the Aba Al-Raha in the Madinah region, as revealed by the Saudi Geological Survey (SGS).
